Pastors Corner

Dear St Mary's and Appleton parishioners, We give thanks to God for the moisture for our farmlands, pastures and ground. But the storm did lots of damage taking down over 200 electrical polls and interrupting almost everyone's power. The Church and rectory were out for only 30 hours. On Wednesday, the Solemnity of St Joseph when preparing for Mass, the power was going on and off as the storm began. I began Mass by saying we were probably going to lose power, but we would be fine with candlelight. Before long, we had a very solemn, Rorate Caeli (Latin for Heavenly Shower, a special candlelight Mass in Advent) like Mass in complete darkness except for the six candles on the altar (and a flashlight at ambo). I could vaguely see people in the congregation, but the Altar of Sacrifice was shining in the dark. The darkness took away every distraction as we worshipped God and celebrated the humble and holy Husband of Mary.

The next day, I was happy to offer the Mass again in the dark and more cold. The chill and nearly empty Church (three of us total) sent me back to a Benedictine Monastery called Fontgombault in central France where is spent a week of discernment in January of 1985. The monks get up at 4 a.m. to chant Matins (first prayers in the Brievery) in Latin and there were just two in the pews. The rest of the hours had some daylight. It was early but beautiful and prayerful. That week I grew in respect for these Benedictine brothers and priests, but could not see myself called to such a life.

During Lent, we are called to make sacrifices. The loss of power allowed us to have some inconvenience and cold meals. Four in a row were enough to renew my appreciation for electricity and stoves. Our home is well insulated and remained in the 60s until the last hours. Blankets and books kept us content. The first hot meal was really nice.

I want to thank those who helped shovel the snow. I know that Tim Prothman helped and Frs. Schukei and Ventre did the majority of the sidewalks. I am not certain who did the parking lot with the big equipment, but I have a hunch. Thanks!

Our Parish Mission was truncated due to the storm. I was prepared to make a lot of pasta, so I may do that on Saturday. I am very grateful for the priests, religious sisters, Danny and each person who came out at night. Also, thanks to those who cooked the food and came to enjoy the meals.

If you are still without power, I hope you are OK. Please contact the rectory if you need help.
